♦ RAM JANMABHOOMI ♦

The birthplace of Lord Rama, this sacred site holds immense religious significance for Hindus and is a symbol of faith and devotion.

♦ HANUMAN GARHI ♦

A revered temple dedicated to Lord Hanuman, believed to protect Ayodhya. No visit to Ayodhya is complete without visiting Hanuman Garhi.

♦ DASHRATH MAHAL ♦

The royal palace of King Dashrath, father of Lord Ram.

♦ KANAK BHAVAN ♦

It is a beautiful temple believed to be Devi Sita's private palace, gifted by Queen Kaikeyi after her marriage to Lord Ram. Renovated by King Vikramaditya and later by Vrish Bhanu Kunwari, it houses the main idols of Lord Ram and Devi Sita in its sanctum. A must-visit for devotees!

♦ NAGESHWAR TEMPLE ♦

It is dedicated to Lord Shiva and is located near Ram Ki Paidi. It was established by Kush, son of Lord Ram. According to legend, a Nag-Kanya found his lost armlet in the Saryu River and fell in love with him. As she was a devotee of Lord Shiva, Kush built this temple in her honor.

♦ KALERAM MANDIR ♦

An iconic temple known for its striking black statue of Lord Ram, worshipped by devotees for centuries.

♦ RAM KI PAIDI ♦

A series of beautifully constructed ghats along the Saryu River, ideal for evening aarti and spiritual gatherings.

♦ MANI PARVAT ♦

A revered hill believed to be associated with Lord Hanuman, offering spiritual significance and panoramic view of the city.

3 KM AWAY

♦ SURAJ KUND ♦

It is dedicated to Surya Dev and built by Suryavanshi rulers. According to legend, it was constructed by King Darshan, a descendant of Lord Ram. It's holy waters are believed to have healing properties and wash away sins of devotees. The laser light show is a captivating evening performance that tells the story of Lord Ram. ♦ GUPTAR GHAT ♦

A tranquil ghat on the banks of Saryu River where Lord Ram is believed to have taken his final journey to Vaikuntha.

♦ BHARAT KUND ♦

During Lord Ram's exile, Bharat ji placed Ram's footwear (khadau) on the throne and performed penance here for 14 years. This site is also considered to be where Lord Ram performed the last rites(pind-daan) of his father, King Dashrath, upon returning from exile.

Chhapia is the birthplace of Swami Narayanji, the revered saint and founder of the Swami Narayan-Akshardham temples on the Ayodhya-Katra-Mankapur road.
